We recently had volunteers join us from CAMC Memorial and I just want to thank them along with the United Way of Central West Virginia. This was one of the most successful Day of Caring we have hosted here at the World Scouting Museum.

Unfortunately I have been unable to find someone to assist us with JOTA/JOTI this year, so we will be working towards hosting a program next year for the event.

If you are interested in HAM radio, please reach out to the Museum Curator if you would like to us for JOTA/JOTI 2026. We are sorry we were unable to make that program happen this year.

We have recently lost our ability to get AmeriCorps members, due to changes in the program requirements, museums are no longer eligible if they do not have a historic site that they manage.

Luckily, we have retained Nic for a bit longer until we can find another program to fill that void. We need to raise some funds to help pay her, so please think about donating to us so we can offer more and keep things moving forward. She has been an amazing help to the museum and myself, so I am thrilled we can keep her a bit longer.

The Museum will also need a bit of funding to help utilize and move the ACOV RV throughout WV, we are working to raise \$20,000 or \$4,000 for the next 5 years. We need to keep another employee so we can utilize the mobile museum to the fullest of our plans.



The Africa and Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Conferences: One down, One TO GO!

The World Scouting Museum has been present at many of the Regional Scout Conferences. Dr. Horne, our Executive Director, recently returned from Madagascar, where he attended the Africa Scout Conference. There he met with Scouts from Africa and worked to trade items and secure donations from African Scout Organizations to share with Scouts at the World Scouting Museum.

The Africa Scout Conference was held from September 18-21, 2025 in Antananarivo, Madagascar.

Dr. Horne will be attending the Asia-Pacific Regional Scout Conference from October 12-17, 2025 in Kaoshiung, Taiwan. Here he will be working to trade and acquire items from members of Scouting Organizations from around Asia, with the same goal as he had in Africa.

We hope that any member Scouts that are attending would find him so that we can increase the visibility of your organization to Scouts that visit the National and World Jamboree site here in West Virginia. We will update you all with more info soon!

<u>Exhibit Spotlight of the Month:</u> COMING OCTOBER 6, A Century of Values RV! Learn about its historic journey and how we plan to utilize it!

The World Scouting Museum is thrilled to announce the donation of the "A Century of Values" (ACOV) Recreation Vehicle (RV) by the Non-Profit Organization A Century of Values based in Michigan, USA.

This substantial donation of a 32-foot Coachmen, Type C, Freelander RV will help extend the programming of the World Scouting Museum by enabling us to outfit it as a Mobile Museum Unit, utilize it for marketing purposes, and establish pop-up museums throughout West Virginia.

The ACOV RV is outfitted with a custom Scouting-themed wrap that includes Scouting America's Scout Oath and Scout Law, Scout Handbooks, and a custom Scouting Mural created by Comic Book Artist and Bongo Comics Co-Founder Bill Morrison, an Eagle Scout.

The ACOV RV began its original journey on February 7, 2009, on an adventure called "A Century of Values" to commemorate and celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America (now Scouting America).

The ACOV RV traveled 49,000 miles throughout the United States during the trip, concluding on February 8, 2010. Donated by All American Homes/Coachmen and driven by 16 road teams of adult volunteer Scouters from Southeast Michigan. The ACOV also logged an additional 8,000 miles in "Victory Laps" around Michigan and other Boy Scout councils outside the state, and participated in parades, camporees, and special events.

We will be receiving the ACOV RV around October 6, 2025, and we are hoping to take it with us to the upcoming Summit Trade-O-Ree soon after. However, this donation was unplanned, and we have only had about 6 months to prepare to receive it. We are a bit concerned about the cost of upkeep for the ACOV RV, and we have started a donation campaign that you can find on our Exhibit Spotlight page by scanning the QR Code next to this article.

The Exhibit Spotlight contains more history about the ACOV RV, our plans to utilize it, and our podcast on it. There is a lot of information we cannot include here so check it out now!
